For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees?

But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. – Romans 8:24-25

When I was growing up, I am not sure I ever heard the word "Advent." But whether I was celebrating the correct church season or not, I was definitely living in a time of anticipation. I was anticipating Christmas Eve night and all day on Christmas when I would have the chance to open lots of presents. I am not sure I ever remember seeing the first candle of an Advent wreath, commonly called the candle of "hope," lit when I was a child. Yet, I certainly knew what I was hoping to receive. I always had a list. It was a list of the "things" that I thought would make me happy. My hope for those presents was always high because I had seen what my parents, the rest of my family, and even Santa Claus had done in the past. They had rarely disappointed me. So, I never had a fear that they would disappoint me in the future. I had reason to have high hopes.

As the family of God, we have reason to have higher hopes than a child at Christmas. We have reason to have hope in the victory of Christ for us and for the world. We have reason to hope for the return of our Messiah. We have reason to hope for the guidance of God. We have reason to hope for Christ to provide mercy and justice for us and through us. We have reason to have hope because we have seen Christ come into the world before. We have seen Christ make a difference.

The birth of Christ, the ministry of Christ, the sacrifice of Christ, the resurrection of Christ, the ascension of Christ, and everything else that Christ did were all a part of his redeeming work for us and for the world. Everything that Christ did fulfilled the prophecy of the one that would be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. Jesus never failed to fulfill prophecy and he never failed to meet the greatest need of people.

During the season of Advent, we are reminded that our "hope" is found in the one who has never failed. Our hope is found in the one that is working in our lives today. Our hope is found in the one who has promised to return and finish his redemptive work.

All of those presents that I received as a child were great for a time. Unfortunately, I no longer have any of them. Some were broken. Some were lost. I simply lost interest in others. Those gifts for which I had hoped, only lasted for a time. As the family of God, our hopes are placed in the gifts of Christ that will never be taken away. During this Advent season, and every season, I invite you to remember and celebrate that Christ gives us reason to have high hopes.

Glorious God, we praise you for the hope that we have had, the hope we have, and the hope we will always have through the work of Christ. Guide us as we celebrate the hope that is available to us by sharing it with others. Amen.
