From Your Minister - Christian Smith

Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, O righteous, And shout for joy, all you upright in heart. - Psalm 32:11

We read in Exodus that the Israelites spent 430 years as slaves in Egypt. God sent Moses to urge Pharaoh to set his people free. It took ten plagues, including the death of all of Egypt's first born, before Pharoah finally released their slaves. But, as Israel fled captivity, Pharoah and the Egyptians changed their minds. The army was sent to bring the Israelites back. Israel was blocked by the Egyptian army on one side and the Red Sea on the other. While they felt trapped, God had a plan. God parted the Red Sea, and the Israelites were allowed to cross on dry ground. When the Egyptian army attempted to follow, the sea crashed back in on them.

Israel was finally free. The above verse was part of a song that was sung by Moses and the Israelites after they crossed through the Red Sea. They had seen the work of God and they wanted to rejoice in God's steadfast love for them. What they did not know was that this was not the end of their journey. They would soon find themselves wandering in the desert for 40 years before they were allowed to enter into the Promised Land. Then, when they finally reached their new home, they would find themselves constantly at risk of violence from other nations.

Yet, through all of the trials, God would continue to lead them in "steadfast love." The Hebrew word for love in this passage is *hesed*. While difficult to translate, it is understood as a sense of love and loyalty that inspires merciful and compassionate actions toward another person. The greatest act of mercy and compassion that was ever produced by God's love and loyalty is the gift of a Messiah. It is that Messiah who gives us hope, peace, and joy as we walk through the wilderness of life.

We are only a few days away from the celebration of Christmas. For many, it will be a great break from the troubles of the world around them. Yet, we know that Christmas will not be an end to our trials and troubles. Thankfully, we have a Savior who will guide us through the wilderness of this world and to the eternity that is promised by the God who offers us "steadfast love."

Lord, thank You for your steadfast love that leads me through the wilderness and promises me hope, peace, and joy for eternity. Amen.
