From Your Minister - Christian Smith

"Therefore, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive."

— Acts Colossians 3:12-13

In the sermon on Sunday morning, we talked about the importance of love. We spoke about the fact that God loves all people, and that God expects us to love everyone. During the sermon, we also mentioned the fact that loving others means that we offer them forgiveness.

One of the great ways that God has shown love for us is through forgiveness. We have all strayed far from who we ought to be and what we ought to do. Yet, God continues to forgive us and restore relationship with us. Numerous times in scripture we are commanded to follow this example. When people hurt us, we are supposed to forgive. When people betray us, we are supposed to forgive. When people disappoint us, we are supposed to forgive. Thankfully, God does not treat us as disposable, and we are reminded to not treat our relationships with others as disposable.

When we offer forgiveness to those who have hurt us, we display the love of God. We are urged to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with others. We often think that this is best accomplished with words, but effective evangelism begins with love and forgiveness.

Forgiveness brings healing to our relationships. Forgiveness helps others to feel valued and loved. Forgiveness points people to the salvation of God. Letting go of grudges and forgiving others has also been proven to improve your health. Forgiveness is not always easy, but it is always necessary.


