There are times that the task of offering everything to God can seem extremely daunting. There are times where it would seem that offering every moment and every opportunity to God would seem to take away the opportunity for fun and play. As the people of God, we are encouraged to have fun. We are encouraged to enjoy the time that we are given on this earth. Yet, even as we are having fun, we can be stewards who share God's blessings. Jesus went to the party and helped to make sure others had fun. Jesus went to the party with whoever invited him. Jesus sought to make sure that all people were included in the party. He had fun, but he also used the opportunity to share an example of love and hope. That is stewardship at its finest.


Outdoor Worship Service


Back by popular demand. On September 24th we will be worshipping outdoors. We invite you to dress comfortably, bring your lawn chair and worship outside in God's creation.
